




Reception red flags

Do they have any of the following:

Very short of breath
Difficulty breathing
Fitting
Floppy
Gross swelling of face / mouth
Major bleeding
Widespread burns
Non-blanching rash
Deformity of limb
Severe pain
Fails to react to parents
Inconsolable by parents
Marked distress
Babies 28 days old or less
Chemical injury to the eye
